Vicar's Viewpoint

It may be that you have stopped and wondered 'whose church is it anyway?', and you may have lost sleep over this pressing matter. Well, I am among you as one who serves, and I come with the answers – it's yours. It's not mine (save for some arcane laws citing 'temporalities and appurtenances') and neither is it a Club House for the members. It's yours. Yes, you – the one

reading this. From among you a gathering of Christians meets within its walls, and from among that number a vicar is chosen from time to time. The church remains yours, but others may look after it care for it for you.

You will have read some things about the current members needing to modernise the church building. We are one of two churches in London (truly) without a toilet to offer, and we can't easily make you a cuppa if you want to use your church. I know appalling. 

Adopt a Grave

Wandering through the graveyard and enjoying the peace, the sound of birds and insects, you may have looked at the gravestone inscriptions. You may also

have noticed that some graves are planted with flowers or herbs, and wondered how that happened. Their descendants may not be here; so about a hundred of our graves have now been adopted, which means looking after a small patch of ground, caring, weeding and planting, and finding out about that family's history.
