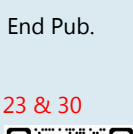
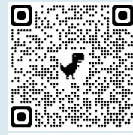

Our Graveyard

It's winter, it's cold and it's rainy. But the graveyard adopters are still there, working alongside the Holy Gardeners. We have had some enthusiastic new grave adopters, and it is lovely to see the newly cared for graves with their attractive planting.

In the autumn we held a gathering with wine and nibbles in the Churchyard. Although it had poured with rain and thundered in the afternoon, in the evening it cleared up and about 30 people came. It was obvious what an important part of the Church the graveyard is and how much interest there is in its development (although there is always room for more!).



I spread out a plan of the graveyard and we found that a few of the graves had been 'double booked' with two adopters. Luckily this was easy to sort out and people were good humoured about the discrepancies. There was also the opportunity to share some stories about what drew people to adopt a particular grave. This was often the case if the grave belonged to a child or a young person, or if

there was a personal or historical interest. One such grave is that of GERTRUDE ALICE BAIRD who died April 25. 1876 aged 17. Recently her grave was visited by her great niece who was pleased to see that it was cared for by the Brownies. It is rare that the graves have family that can tend to them so it is very important that the Teddington community is involved in various ways.

However, there are questions to ask about how we continue to develop and appreciate the churchyard:

Who is the churchyard for? Do you go there, if so why? How can it contribute to diversity and inclusion? Whose responsibility do you think it is? How might you contribute?

Please contact alex@teddingtonparish.org with your views. I am hoping to have another evening gathering in the Churchyard in the spring when thoughts can be aired. It will be looking at its best with the bulbs showing through.
