

### Vicar's Viewpoint

I hope that your year is unfolding as you had hoped, and that your resolutions are still intact. One of my resolutions as your parish priest was to assure myself that I and this parish are a blessing to you wherever you are, whoever you are. Part of the life of the church happens on Sundays; part in specific and planned events during

the week; but part also of often entirely unseen events because the church is tailored to moments in all of our lives that are - in some ways - unforeseen. Indeed, as I write this, I reflect on attendance numbers at Christmas, and all those fun things, but a large proportion of those who graced our pews in 2024 came because of a significant one-off life event. and maybe you were one of them.

The Church of England is a national newsworthy organisation, but locally it is a sum of parts who, during the year are ministering to your families. Through baptisms, marriages and funerals, churches meet you where you are and walk with you in those days of joy or great sadness. We do it without fanfare and we do it - I hope - jolly well. Did you know that if you live in the parish – and you are likely to if you are reading this – you can marry in your church by right? We are ready to baptise you, or your children, and you need only ask. If you have a sense of 'the Other' and only want the Lord's Prayer, we will conduct your loved-ones' funeral without further demand on your spiritual expression or church habit. We are here for you the other six days of the week. We don't keep a register, we don't set a test in the hope that you pass before we will walk alongside you - we will just do it because you asked. For us to do that is our blessing to you - to remove hurdles, and to welcome you here if you have need of us. Whatever this year brings, please know that we are ready to walk with you.



## Cafés in the Community

The cafés, held at the Peter and Paul Centre, offer a place for people to feel included, over good quality coffee, tea and homemade cakes. We host several cafés:

The *Community Café*, is open **every Monday afternoon** 1.30pm to 4.30pm, for anyone who fancies a chat, but particularly those who feel excluded, socially isolated or anxious. It has been lovely to see people come, meet others, and over the months, develop lasting friendships.

The *Memory Café* is open on the **1**<sup>st</sup> and **3**<sup>rd</sup> **Tuesday afternoons** of the month from 1.30pm to 3pm, for those living with memory problems and their carers. At every café, there will be a quiz, bingo or sing-a-long. Our oldest café, it celebrates its 8<sup>th</sup> birthday this year.

The *Bereavement Café* will open in March. It will be hosted in partnership with Princess Alice Hospice, a 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hour café, open to all who have been bereaved. There will be an opportunity to talk to someone trained to listen, and share experiences with others who have been bereaved. Look out for more details in the March edition.

### **Children at SMwSA**

Every Wednesday at 10.30am, St Mary with St Alban's bell chimes out across Teddington. It's being rung by one of the children at Church Mice, our pre-school Toddler Service. Children and their parents/ carers gather to hear a Bible story, sing songs, pray and play. It's a small group, led by church members, and it's a delight to see the children grow and respond to hearing stories of Jesus. Parents and carers have the chance to have a coffee and chat as their children explore the toys and musical instruments. It can be a life-line for those feeling isolated or overwhelmed.

Sunday sees another gathering of children and families at our 9am Morning Worship. Although everyone is welcome, we usually attract between 10–20 family groups and have 20-25 minutes of singing, praying, hearing a Bible story. We learn about how we can live out our faith during the week, and once a month we share Holy Communion. It's noisy, active, fun and faith-filled. A faithful band of volunteers busy themselves in the hall, making coffee and putting out crafts so that we can head there after the service to chat and chill.

Sowing the seeds of faith starts with children being able to gather regularly at Church Mice and Morning Worship. They hear the stories of Jesus and God's love for the world, and they see the difference it makes to us. They might not be able to articulate what's going on, but they know they are loved and welcomed.

Why don't you come along and enjoy worshipping in a different way? And if you can't join us, please pray for us and these communities that gather every week. *Mary Hawes*
