Vicar's Viewpoint

The Christians among us are about to start Lent, and if this is your practice, I hope and pray that these weeks in early spring are a blessing. For my part, I have considered abstaining from Lent but given that I only work an hour per week on a Sunday, it seems churlish! Instead, I am delighted to be offering a Lent Course on the subject of the Beatitudes (the 'blessed are the ...'

bits of the bible) and for 2025 to do this in our usual way on a Wednesday morning in the Parish Hall, but also in smaller home groups. If you wish to join this, there is almost certainly going to be an inky QR splodge on this Newsletter for you to aim your gadget at.

One of the truths for many (if not most) of us is that we are, indeed, truly blessed. If you woke in your own bed(!), ate you own food, walked your beloved hound into the new pink dog salon (which coyness won't let me name here) – you are blessed. In a previous edition of this missive, I spoke of our partner parish in Mozambique and between that edition and this, they have suffered some appalling events. Not one, but two cyclones have hit them (Chido the most devastating), and together with political and religious unrest, have seen the destruction of a good dozen of their churches (including the one that we helped build), and many people scattered into the neighbouring countryside.

It is our custom to have a special Lent Appeal as a focus for specific sacrificial giving – and in 2025, our partner parish in Pemba will be the recipient. I ask that, be you a person of faith or no, you make a donation to this appeal if you can. It will make a very significant difference to people who simply want to be left alone to live their lives. Again, a QR code to your right has been made available for this vital act of kindness.

I close this by wishing you a blessed and holy Lent, and as we look forward to the events that form Easter – but more on that next month.







Return to Me

Ash Wednesday stops us in our tracks. No excuses, no distractions – just the blunt truth: *Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return*. It is not a threat. It is a calling. A call to step away from all that numbs us and return to the One who made us, the One who loves us.

Lent is often framed as a season of giving things up. But before all that, it is a season of return. A season of turning our faces back toward God, of walking home like the prodigal son, unsure of what awaits – only to be met with arms flung wide in welcome.

The ashes are not a mark of shame. They are a sign of mercy. A reminder that even in our frailty, even in the dust and struggle of being human, we are not abandoned. The same God who formed us from the earth bends low to lift us up.

Fairtrade Matters: a Lent Challenge

Almost fifty years ago I signed up to buy Campaign Coffee, not a great drink,



but a forerunner in the FAIRTRADE Fairtrade Movement which used coffee as their flagship product. Subsequently Traidcraft entered the field and I became one of their earliest "reps", holding regular sales of an ever-growing catalogue of products - food, homeware, clothes - all sporting the Fairtrade logo which is now recognised by over 90% of the UK population. Buying fairly traded licensed products (and there are over 4,800 of them in the UK) makes a difference to the income, living standards and independence of formerly exploited families and workers world-wide. With the sad demise of Traidcraft, and as Lent begins, perhaps now might be a good time to add a new shopping tactic? The Co-op supermarket is a good start and wearefairtrade.com and store-transform-trade.org are both useful online suppliers.

Meanwhile, after successful sales of Real Advent Calendars over Christmas, I am offering Meaningful Chocolate Company's Real Easter Eggs (£5.50 each), available during March after the 9 & 10am Sunday services: including a 24-page Easter story activity book and a £200 prize competition. The price of cocoa has quadrupled in recent years, from £2,500 to £10,000/tonne, leaving this the only remaining fairtrade Easter egg producer. So, reserve yours now with me.
